# **ADVOCATE UPDATE**

#### Non-Liability Health Care – White Card

DVA may cover the cost of mental health treatment for veterans without the need to prove it is related to ADF service.

## Cover for Cancer and Pulmonary Tuberculosis Care

DVA may cover the cost of cancer and pulmonary tuberculosis treatment for veterans. DVA do not have to accept their condition as service related.

## Who is Eligible?

Current and former full-time members of the ADF can get free mental health treatment. This includes reservists who have at least one day of continuous full-time service (CFTS).

CFTS is defined as:

full-time service in the permanent forces of the ADF a reservist who has been formally designated to be on full-time service by Defence a reservist who has been called out for full-time service by the Governor General under the Defence Act.

CFTS does not include training conducted as reserve service days.

Reservists without CFTS may still be eligible if they have either: Disaster Relief Service Border Protection Service involvement in a serious service-related training accident.

## What Conditions DVA Cover

DVA cover treatment costs for all mental health conditions, such as: posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) depressive disorder anxiety disorder alcohol use disorder substance use disorder phobias adjustment disorders bipolar disorder.

# What You Need to Know

Before arranging treatment for your eligible client, please be aware that:

the Veteran White Card does not cover NLHC treatment overseas

you need to confirm that you or the relevant provider will accept the Veteran White Card as payment before making an appointment.
