UNMARKED GRAVES - HEADSTONE PROJECT

The Stanthorpe RSL Sub Branch is proud to be involved with rededicating and marking of unmarked WWI Veteran Gravesites in the Stanthorpe Parish as part of our Headstone Project.

The Headstone Project has been underway since 2018 with a number of unmarked sites that relate to veterans that participated in operational service or served within Australia over the period of WWI (1914-1918) having been marked and dedicated.

In continuing with this project, five headstones were dedicated on 27 February 2023 at the Stanthorpe Cemetery.

These were:

- 1. John GRAHAM, Regimental No. 2311, Unit. Australian Remount Unit 2, Squadron 8,
- 2. Charles James LARKINS, Regimental No. 2106. Unit. 41st Battalion,
- 3rd Reinforcement,

3. Bernard MAGUIRE, Regimental No. 3851. Unit. 30th Battalion, 9th Reinforcement, 4. Harold Bernard MANN, Regimental No. 1878. Unit. 33rd Battalion, 2nd Reinforcement, and

5. William WILLIAMS, Regimental No. 2705. Unit. 13th Battalion, 8th Reinforcement.

The dedication was well attended with approximately 30 members of the community attending, including direct relatives of PTE Harold Mann - Rae Gleeson, Margaret Smith and Mark Winkler (pictured below). Reverend John Pattison conducted the service, Mrs Lisa Vichie played the bagpipes and Mr Darren Uhlmann played the bugle. Overall, a highly successful event.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND THE SUB BRANCH

War Animal Day - 24 February 2023

The purple poppy was created in 2006 by UK charity Animal Aid as a way to commemorate animals which served during conflicts as they had been the forgotten victims of war. In 2013 the Australian War Animal Memorial Organisation introduced the purple poppy to Australia. This poppy is sometimes referred to as the Animal Poppy. They are worn alongside the traditional red poppy as a reminder of their bravery and that both humans and animals served together. Animals have been put to many uses in war, serving as transport, beasts of burden, messengers, protectors, mascots, and pets. They have played an important part in all wars in which Australians have been involved.

The plaque in our Memorial Garden reads:

Robbie Robertson Memorial Garden - "This garden honours those who served and are still serving, those that supported them and those who waited for them."

And on either side of this plaque, there is a small bouquet of red and purple poppies. We remember the service of the many animals that have been beside us in many of those far away and dangerous places.
