While you are encouraging your mates to join the league consider if you have some time and energy to assist us to assist you, other veterans, families and community members. Remember we assist those in need, we also remember service and deeds, and inspire others undertake civic responsibilities.

Not only do we have vacancies on the board, there are openings to assist in the many commemorative and ceremonial activities we arrange and other activities we participate in. We are not looking for any particular skill sets rather a willingness to be involved, coupled with an engaging attitude. We can provide guidance and on job training and on occasion attendance on workshops and other training opportunities.

Speaking of this, from time to time openings arise that allow us to provide a means to enhance skills and knowledge for our volunteers.
